## Strong commitment for improving CRVS in the Pacific

The <u>Brisbane Accord Group</u> (including SPC, WHO, UNICEF and ESCAP) in collaboration with the United Nations Statistics Division convened a Regional Meeting on Civil Registration and Vital Statistics for Pacific Islands from 22 to 25 February 2016. The meeting brought together civil registrars, national statistics officers and national health information officers and managers from 19 countries and territories in the Pacific to share experiences in improving CRVS systems over the last 4 years of the Pacific Vital Statistics Action Plan.



#### Toolkit for assessing civil registration of asylum seekers, refugees, stateless persons

and persons of undetermined nationality The Regional Support Office of the Bali Process on People Smuggling, Trafficking in Persons and Related Transnational Crime has initiated a project to develop a toolkit for interested States to analyse and improve how they register births, deaths and marriages of these key population subgroups. The toolkit will be based on international standards, recommendations and case studies of good practice. It is expected that the toolkit will be published for use in the second half of 2016. 
