New democracy, ongoing decentralization


- 34 provinces, 500+ districts, 77126 villages | 17504 Islands

Law No. 24, 2006 on Population Administration amended in 2013 defined vital events as those events experienced by a person including:

- Birth
- Death
- Stillbirth
- Marriage & Divorce,
- Child Recognition
- Children Adoption
- Change of Name
- Change of Citizenship

Long Term National Development Plan (RPJPN) 2005-2025

- Population administration arrangement to support planning and the implementation of sustainable development, and guaranty of population rights and social protection.
- Social welfare development in order to provide protection of disadvantaged groups of society enhanced through strengthening of supported social security institutions by laws and regulations, funding, and population ID number (NIK).
- The provision of social security is carried out taking into account the culture and institutions that are already rooted in Public.

Mid Term National Development Plan (RPJMN) 2019-2024



In 2024, **100%** Population should have population ID Number (NIK), Birth Certificate, Marriage Book, Divorce Certificate and also death certificate and the record of the causes of death.




