## 16<sup>th</sup> largest by landmass

## 4<sup>th</sup> largest by population

- 270 million people | 85.2 million children (2020 census) | 360 ethnic groups | 250 local languages



## New democracy, ongoing decentralization

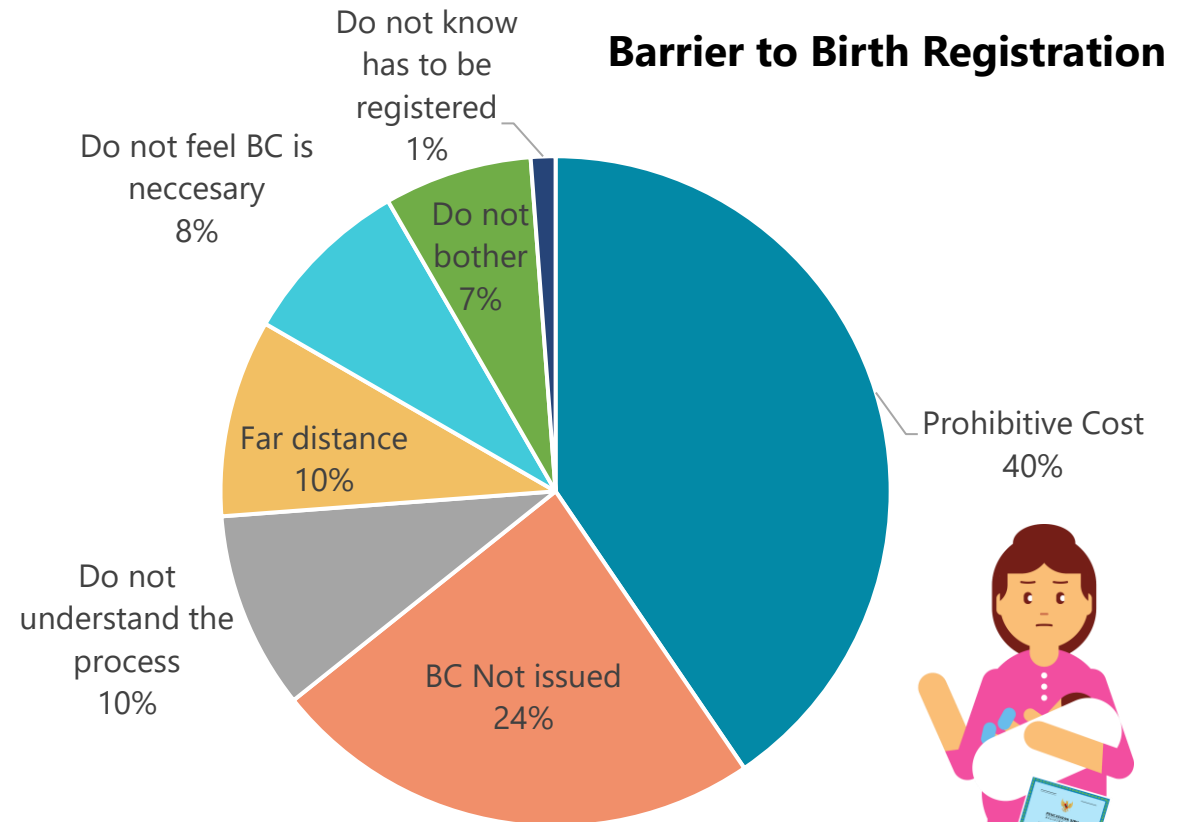
- 34 provinces, 500+ districts, 77126 villages | 17504 Islands



## COVID-19

- Largest number of cases in Southeast Asia

- People with special condition face more challenges; unreached and unidentified
- Rural and remote areas have lower coverage

Civil Registration and Vital Statistics in Indonesia

## Law No. 24, 2006 on Population Administration

amended in 2013 defined vital events as those events experienced by a person including:

- Birth
- Death
- Stillbirth
- Marriage & Divorce,
- Child Recognition
- Children Adoption
- Change of Name
- Change of Citizenship



# CRVS in Development Planning

## Long Term National Development Plan (RPJPN) 2005-2025

- **Population administration** arrangement to support **planning and the implementation of sustainable development**, and guaranty of population rights and social protection.
- Social welfare development in order to provide **protection of disadvantaged groups of society** enhanced through strengthening of supported social security institutions by laws and regulations, funding, and population **ID number** (NIK).
- The provision of social security is carried out taking into account the culture and institutions that are already rooted in Public.

## Mid Term National Development Plan (RPJMN) 2019-2024



In 2024, **100%** Population should have population ID Number (NIK), Birth Certificate, Marriage Book, Divorce Certificate and also death certificate and the record of the causes of death.

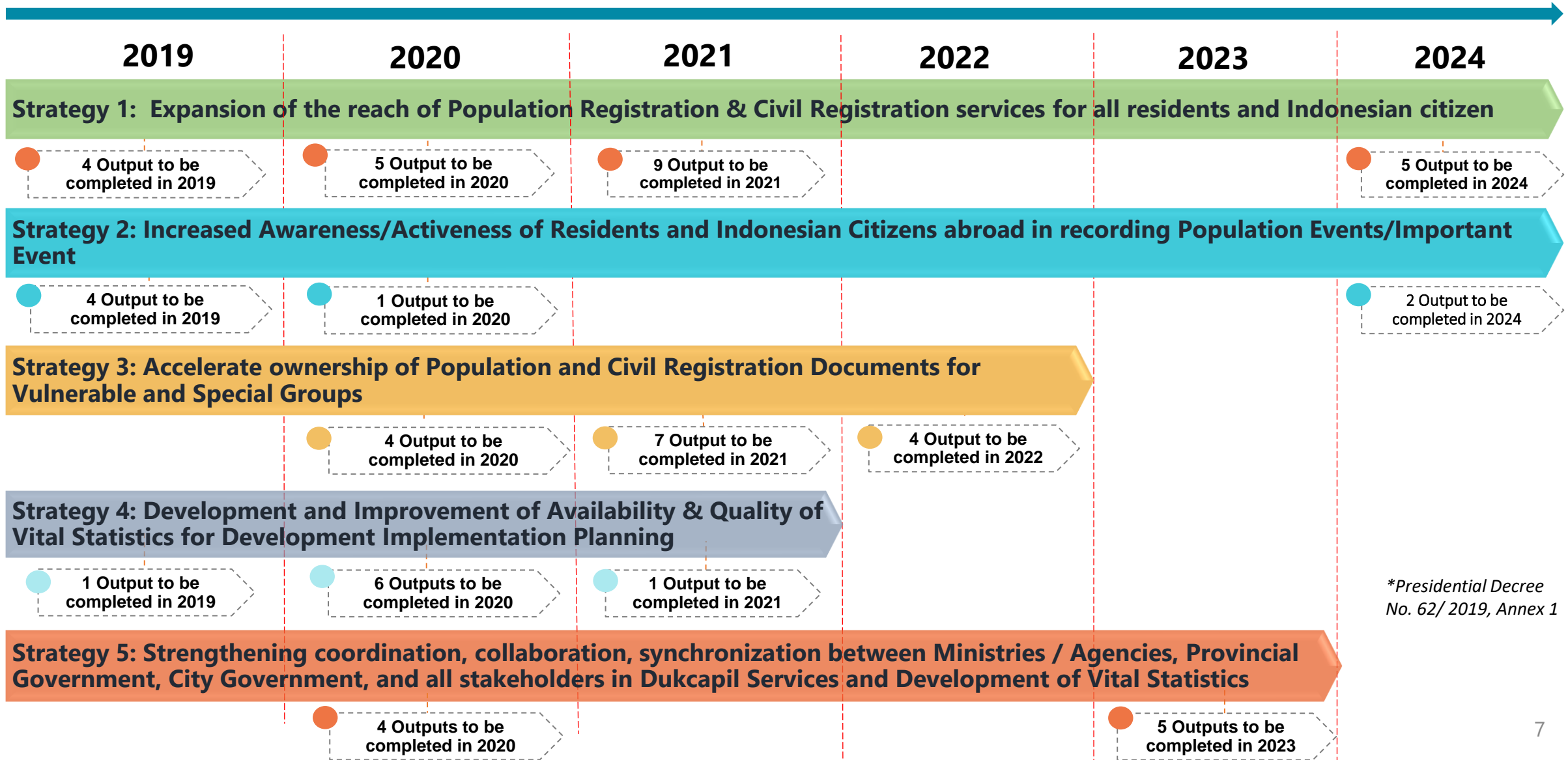
