









Civil Registration: Essential throughout one's life


Targets


- **1E** Recording of causes of death by the health sector

- **3H** Publication of a vital statistics report



Birth registration: Progress is bridging the gap between regions



Unregistered children under five decreased from 135million in 2012 to 64 million in 2019





Note: The figure is based on an estimated 356.4 million children under five, and 64.4 million of them unregistered (18%). Non-regional countries are not included in this graph.
