



1. Global CRVS recommendations

- Since 1948 the United Nations Statistics Division has been mandated with providing methodological framework and international recommendations for civil registration and vital statistics
- Mandate based on the still-in-place model that comprehensive, reliable, regular, accurate and small area vital statistics can be derived only from a fully-functioning registration of all vital events occurring in the country








Civil registration and identification model

Inclusive CRVS policies and practices through increased registration among refugees, asylum seekers, stateless persons and persons of undetermined nationality


Main stakeholders

Bali process toolkit pilots

3. ESCAP guidelines for estimating completeness





Guidelines: contents

- Choice of an appropriate denominator
- General tools for the numerator:
 - * adjustment in respect of anticipated incurred-but-notreported events
 - adjustment in respect of timely registration in the year following occurrence
- Considering the impact of COVID-19 on estimating completeness
- * Birth registration completeness
- * Death registration completeness
