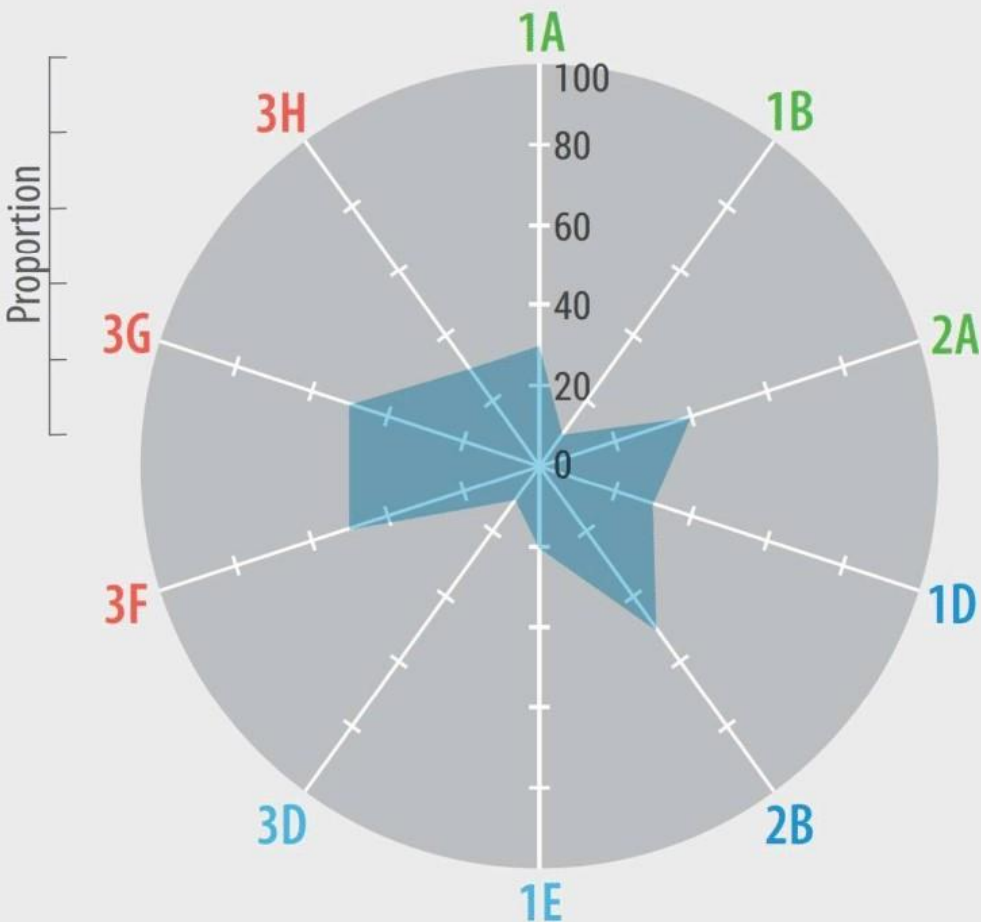

3D: Reduction of ill-defined causes of death codes

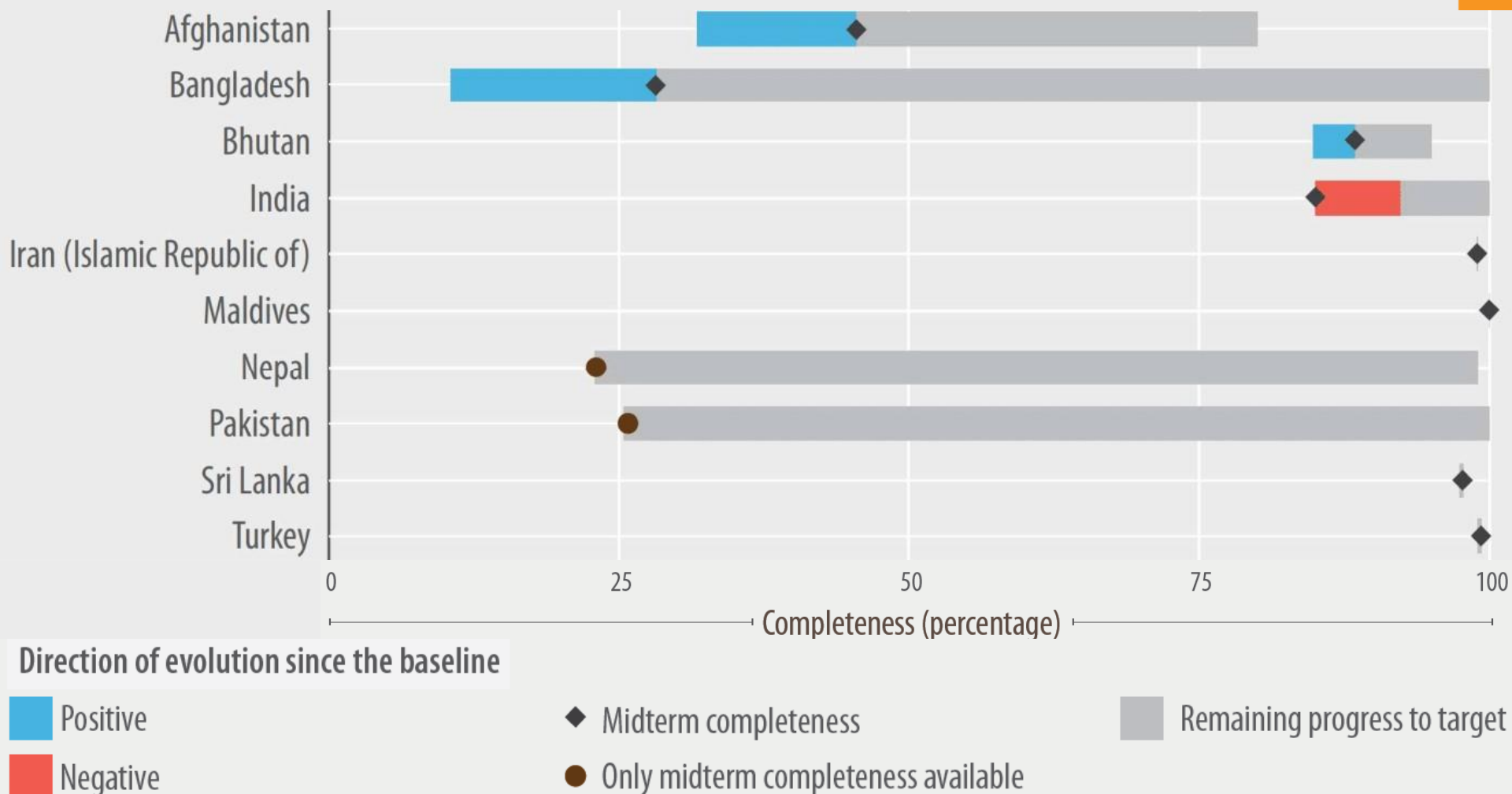
3F: Publication of births and deaths statistics

3H: Publication of a vital statistics report

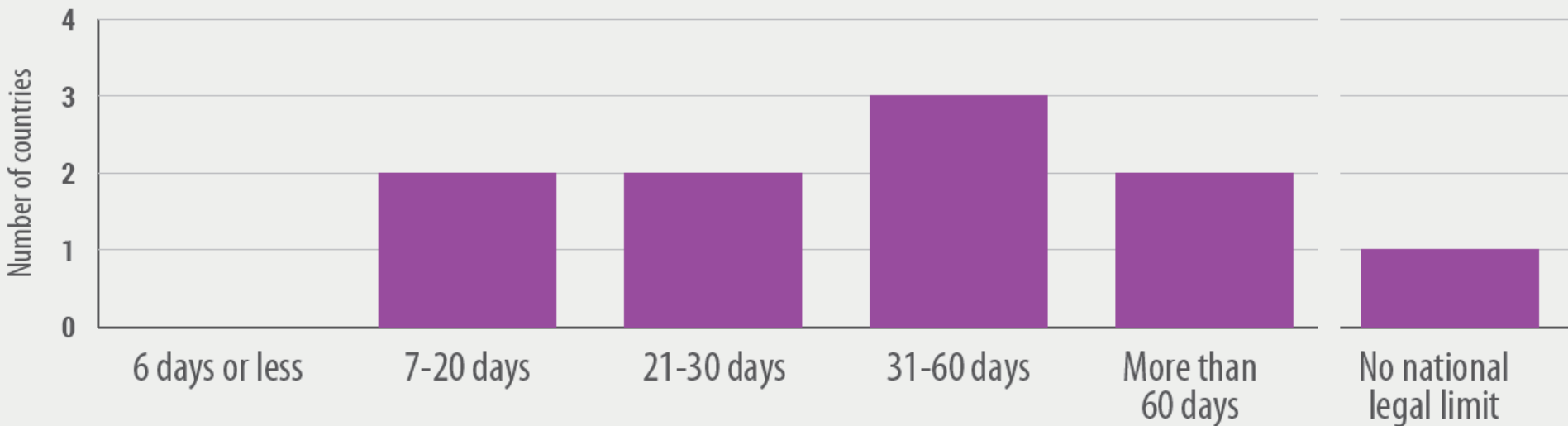
Birth registration:

Reforms lead to **important progresses**, but **obstacles remain**



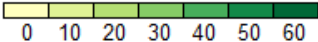
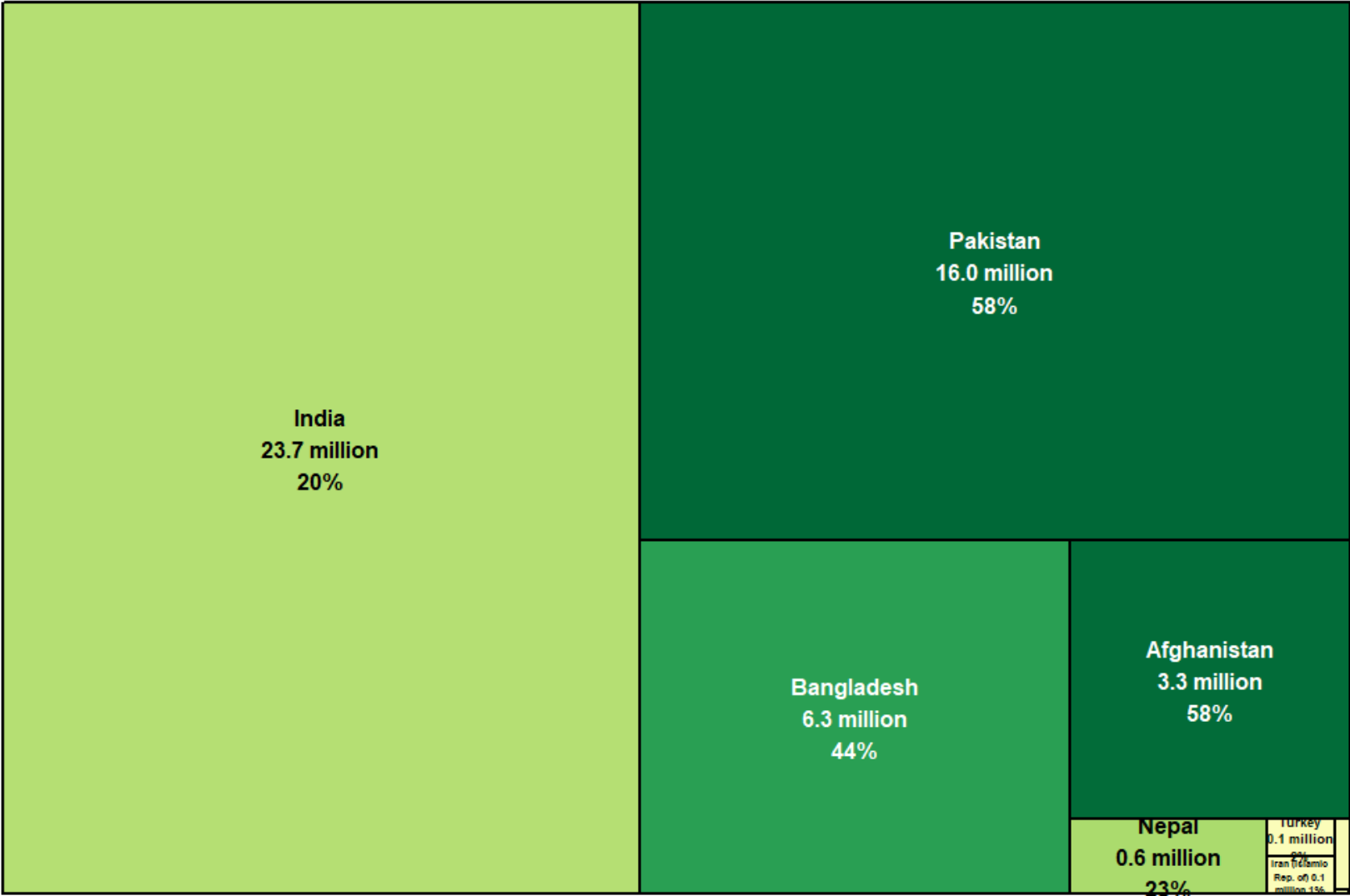
Legal time period to register births:

More time to register vital events

Number of unregistered children under five (SSWA = 50.2 million)

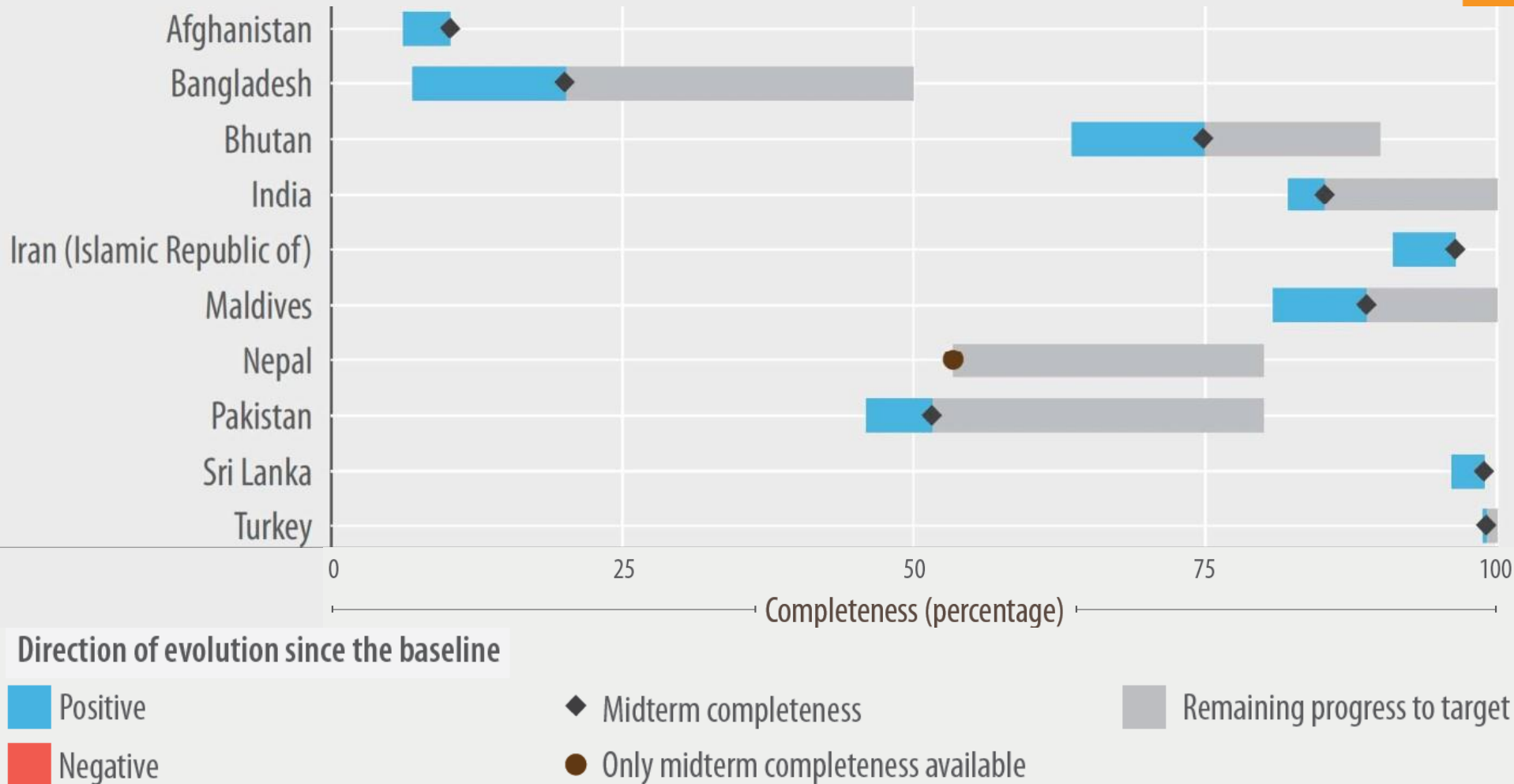


Proportion of unregistered children in each country

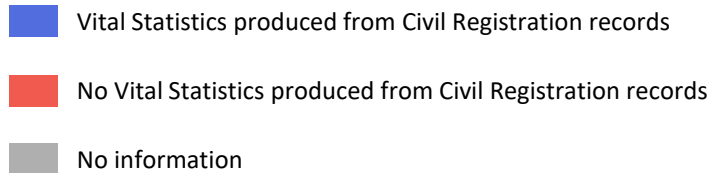
Death registration:

Less **incentives**, lower **completeness**.

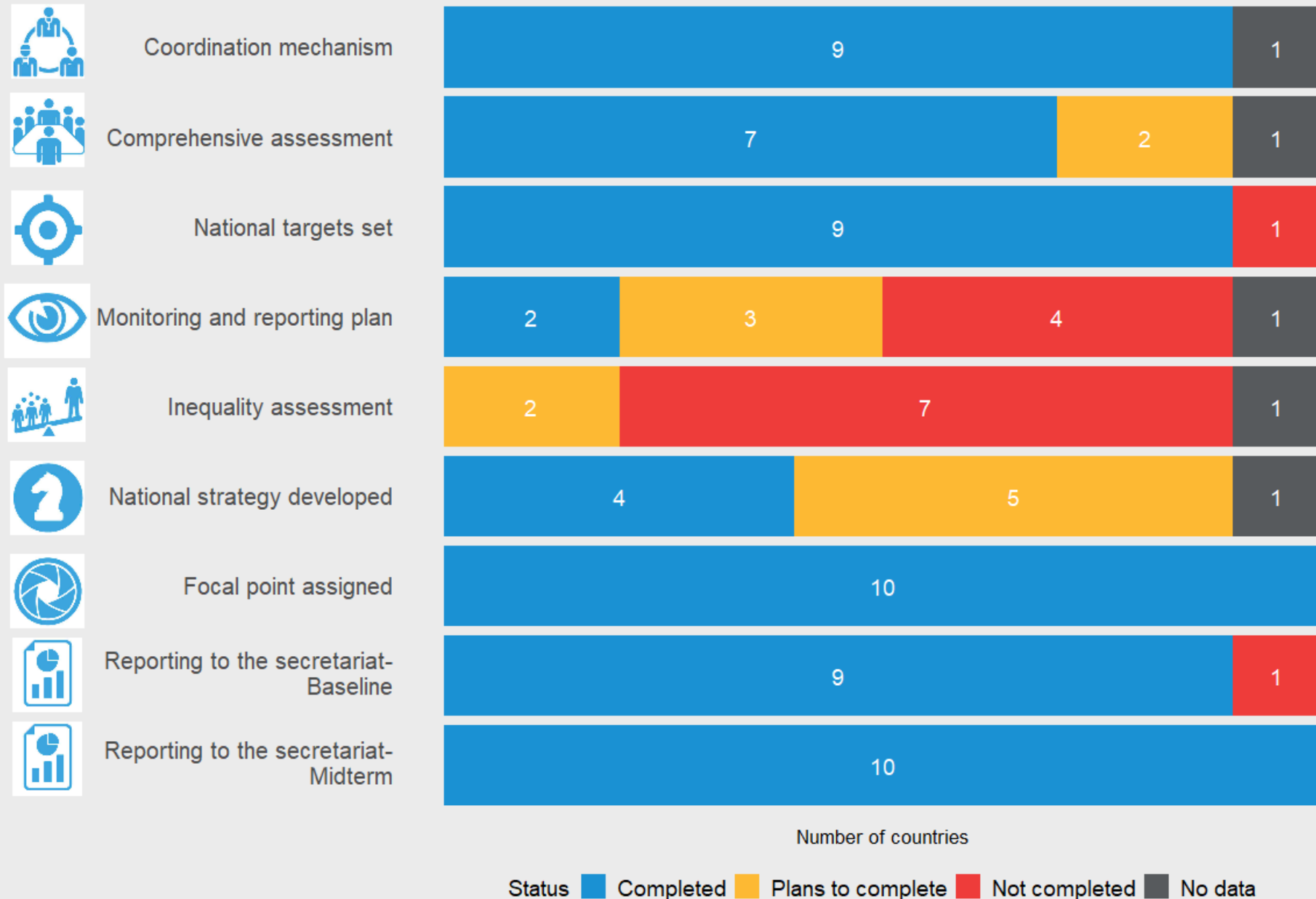
Increased attention **due to COVID-19**
