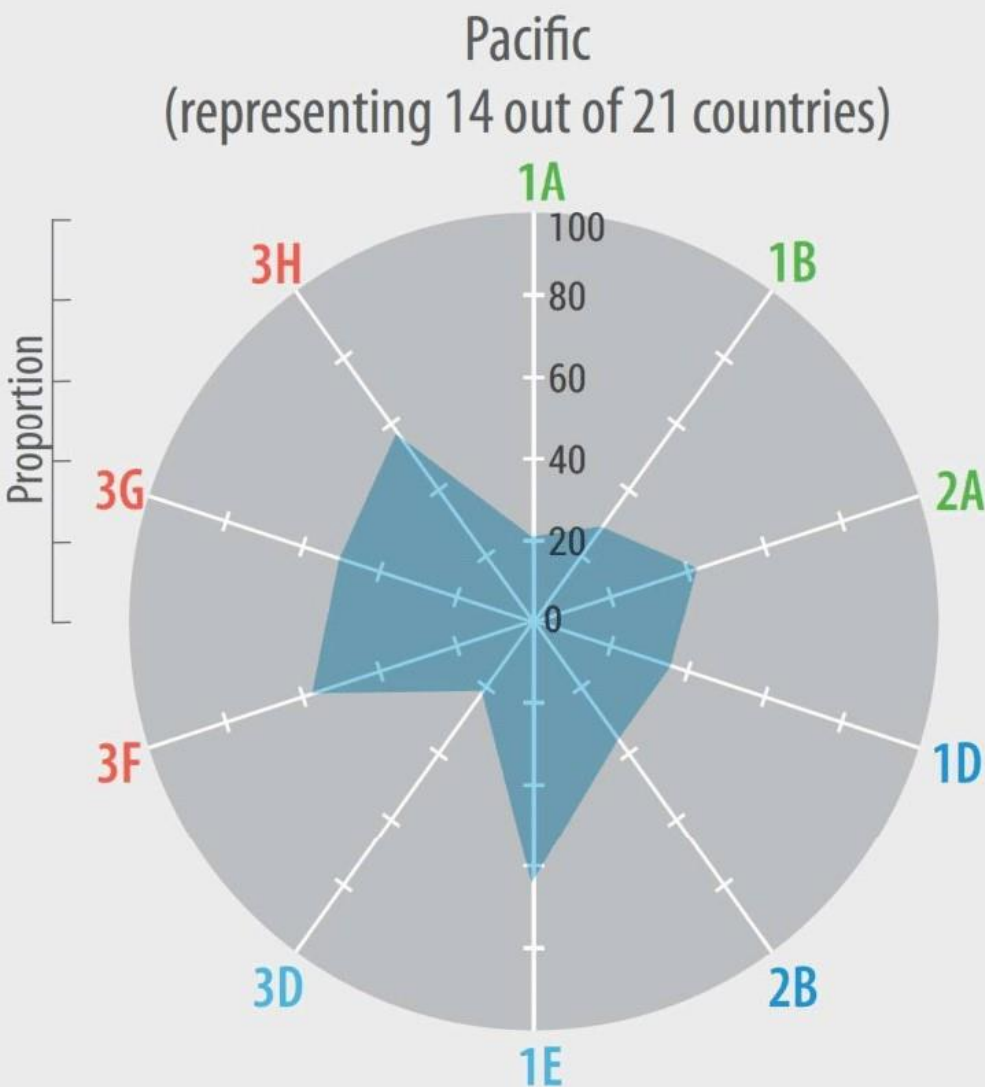

Targets

1A: Birth registration within a year

1B: Birth registration of children under five

2A: Issuance of birth certificates

1D: Death registration within a year

2B: Issuance of death certificates

1E: Recording of causes of death

3D: Reduction of ill-defined causes of death codes

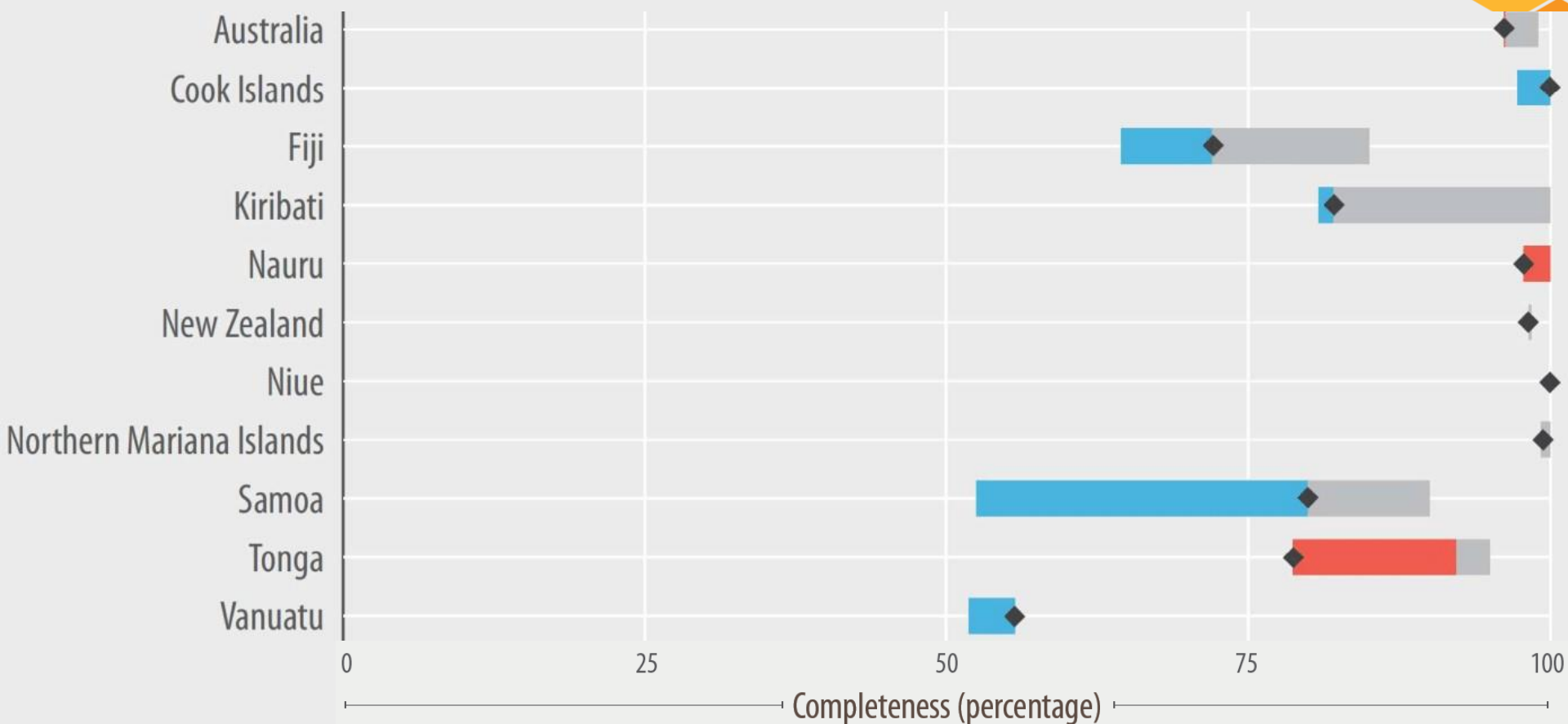
3F: Publication of births and deaths statistics

3G: Publication of causes of death statistics

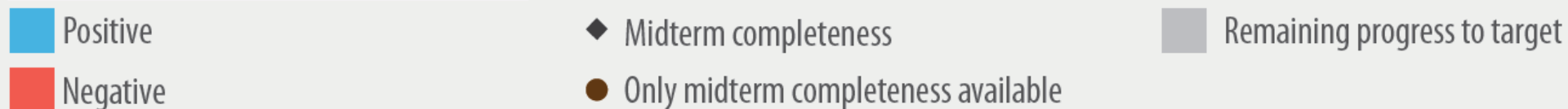
3H: Publication of a vital statistics report

Progress is bridging the gap between countries

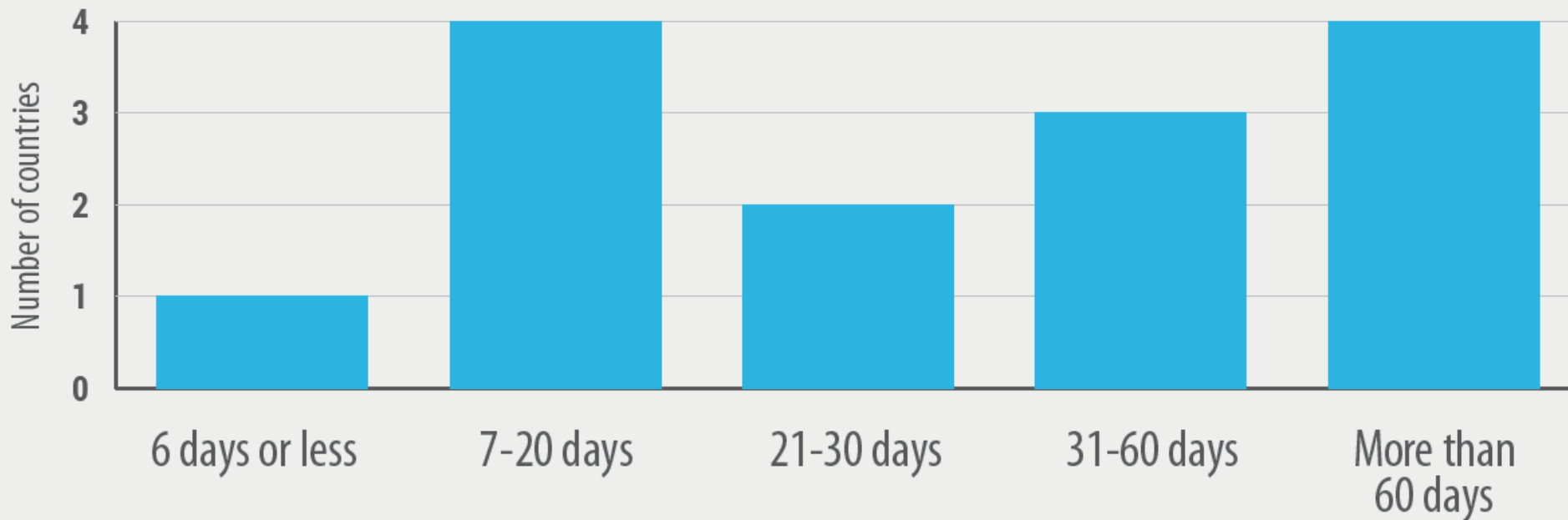


Direction of evolution since the baseline

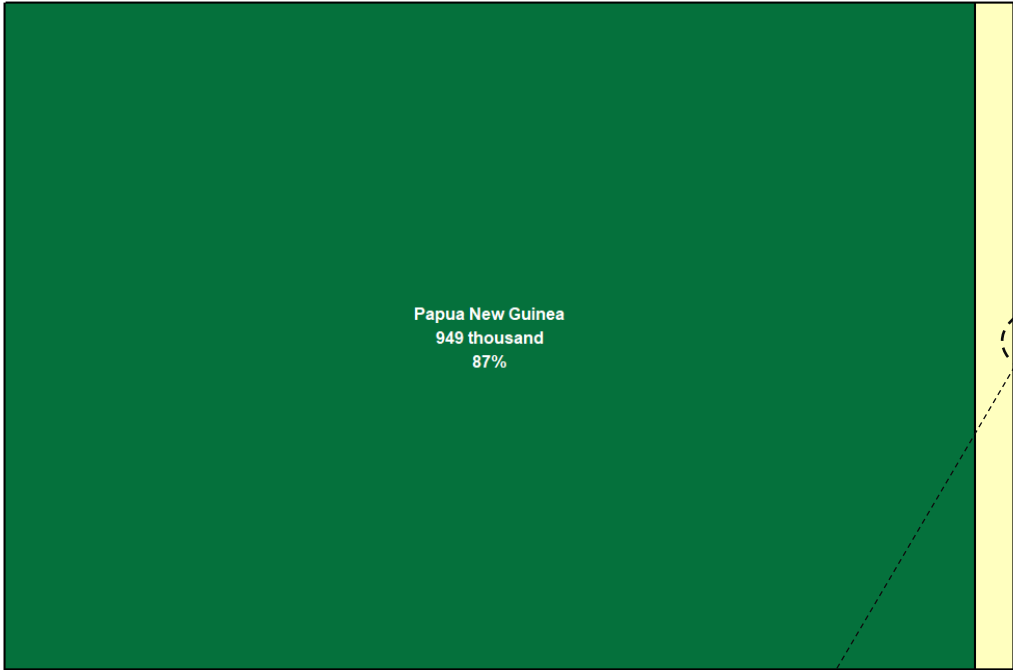


Legal time period to register births:

Different time periods for different systems and situations

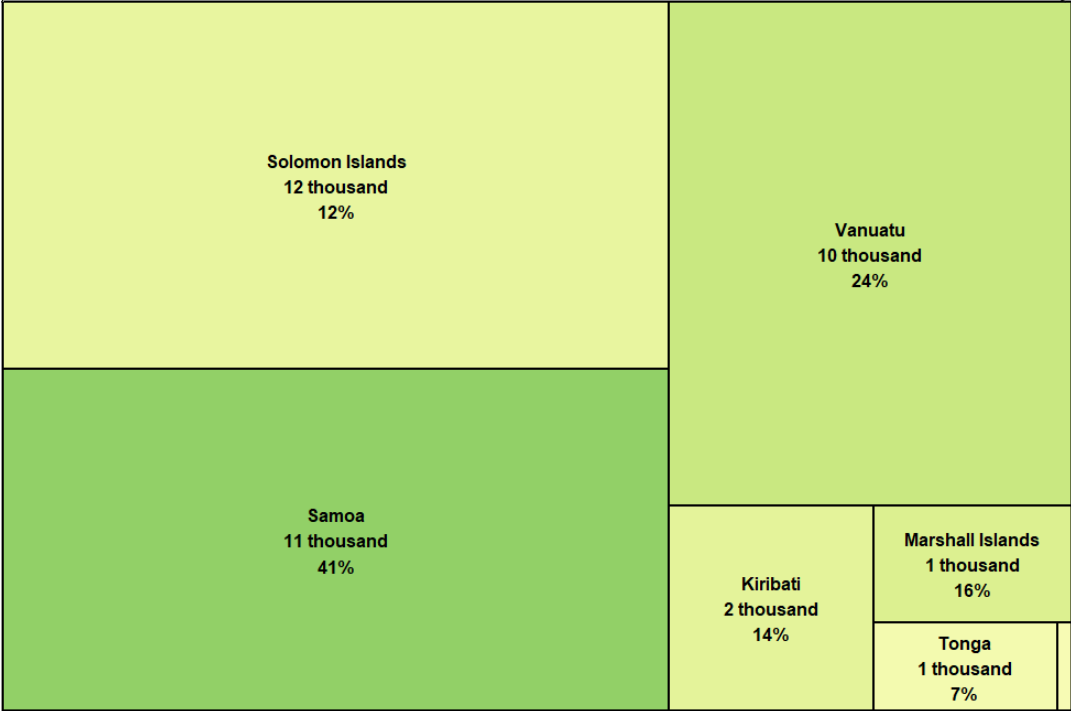


Unregistered children under five

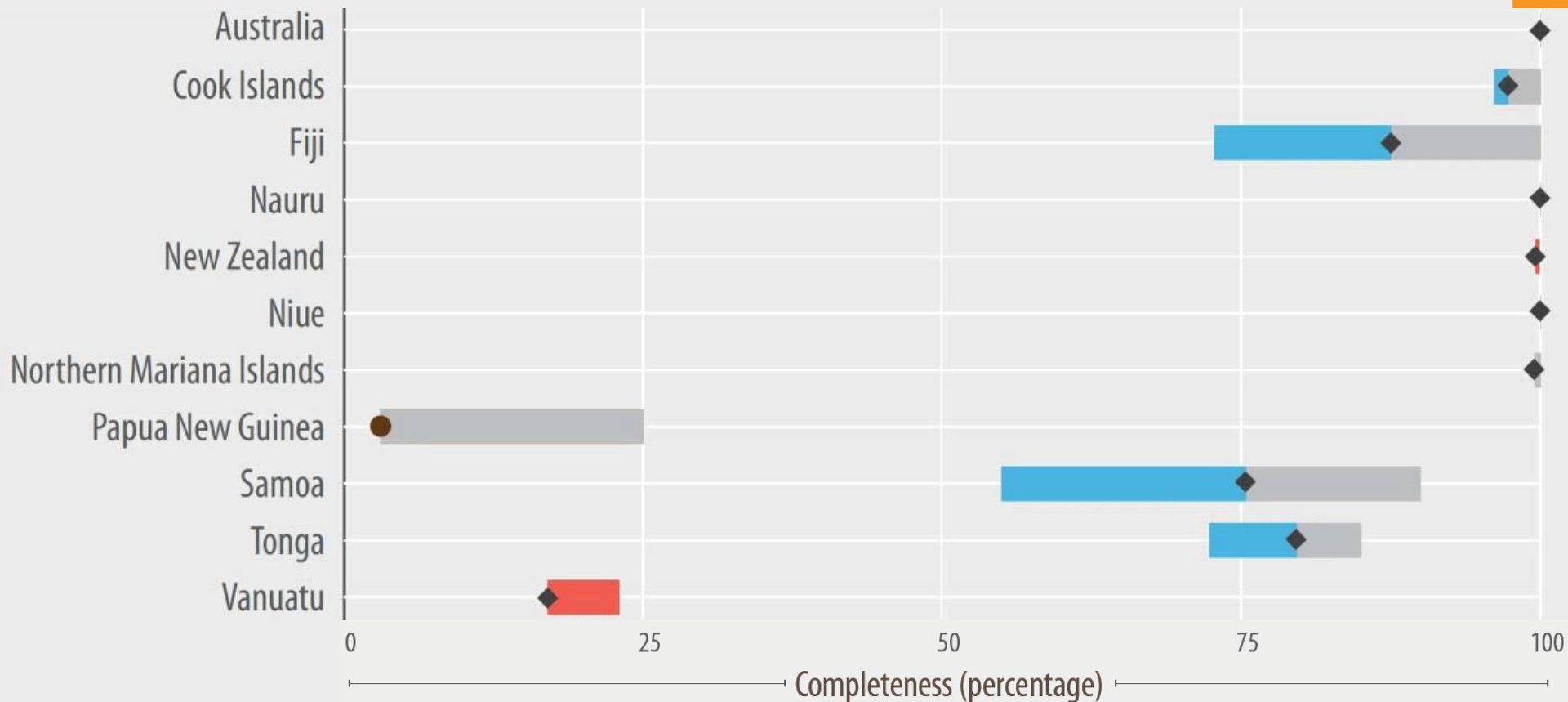

Proportion of unregistered children in each country



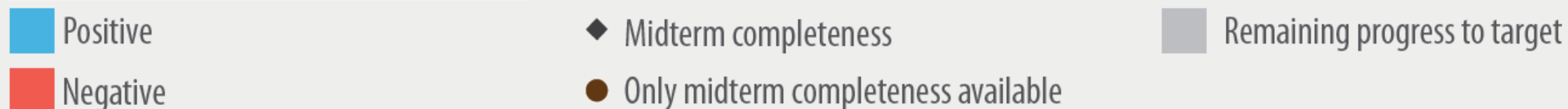
Death registration:

Direction of evolution since the baseline



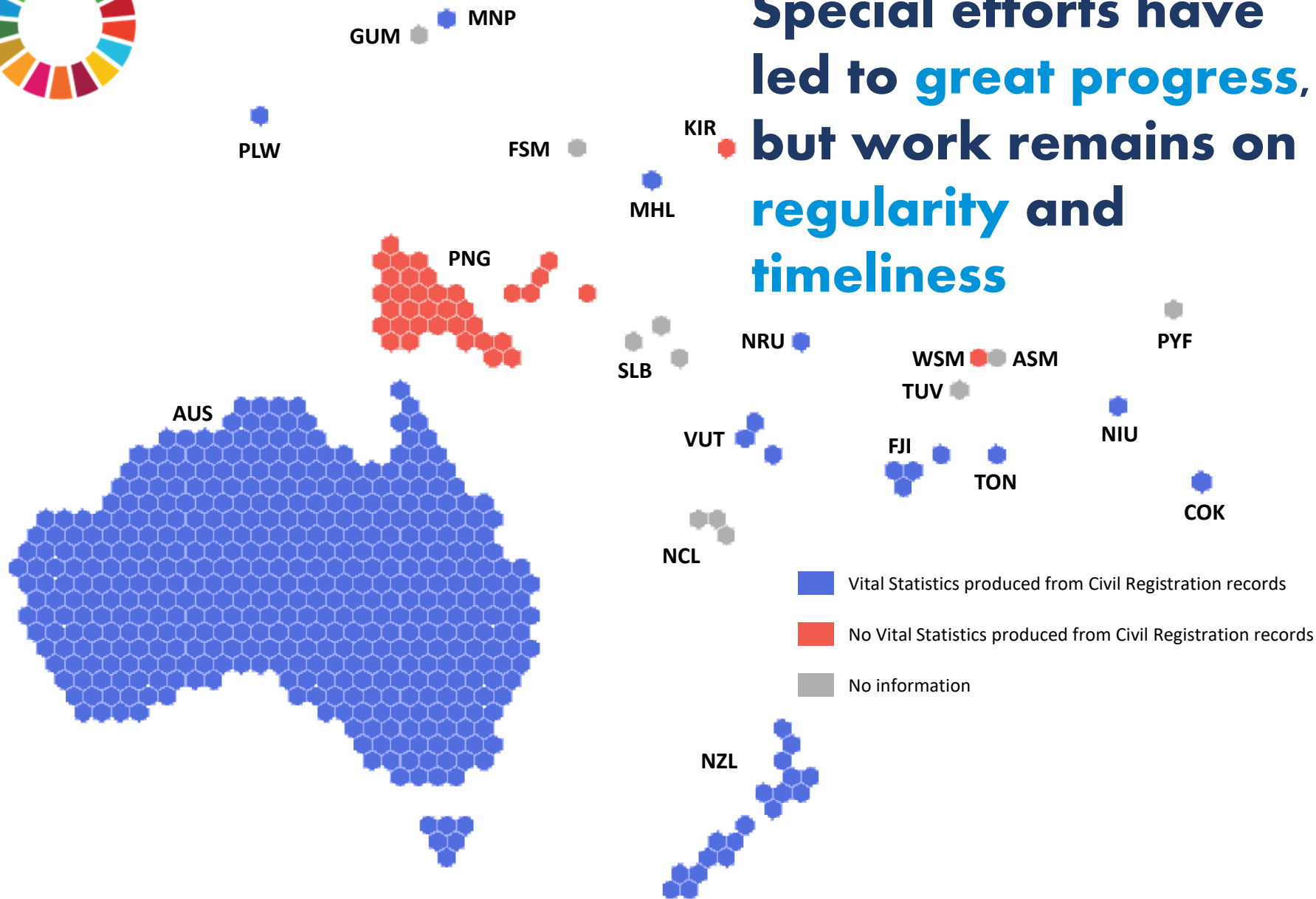
CRVS, an essential tool for disaster mitigation

- Natural disasters are **major threats** to civil registration systems
- Need to make **resilient** through:
 - **Digitalization** of records
 - Improvement of **collaboration**
 - Reform of the **legal framework**
- Robust CRVS systems can be critical in **mitigating** disasters
 - Response **planning**
 - Delivery of emergency services
 - Impact **assessments**

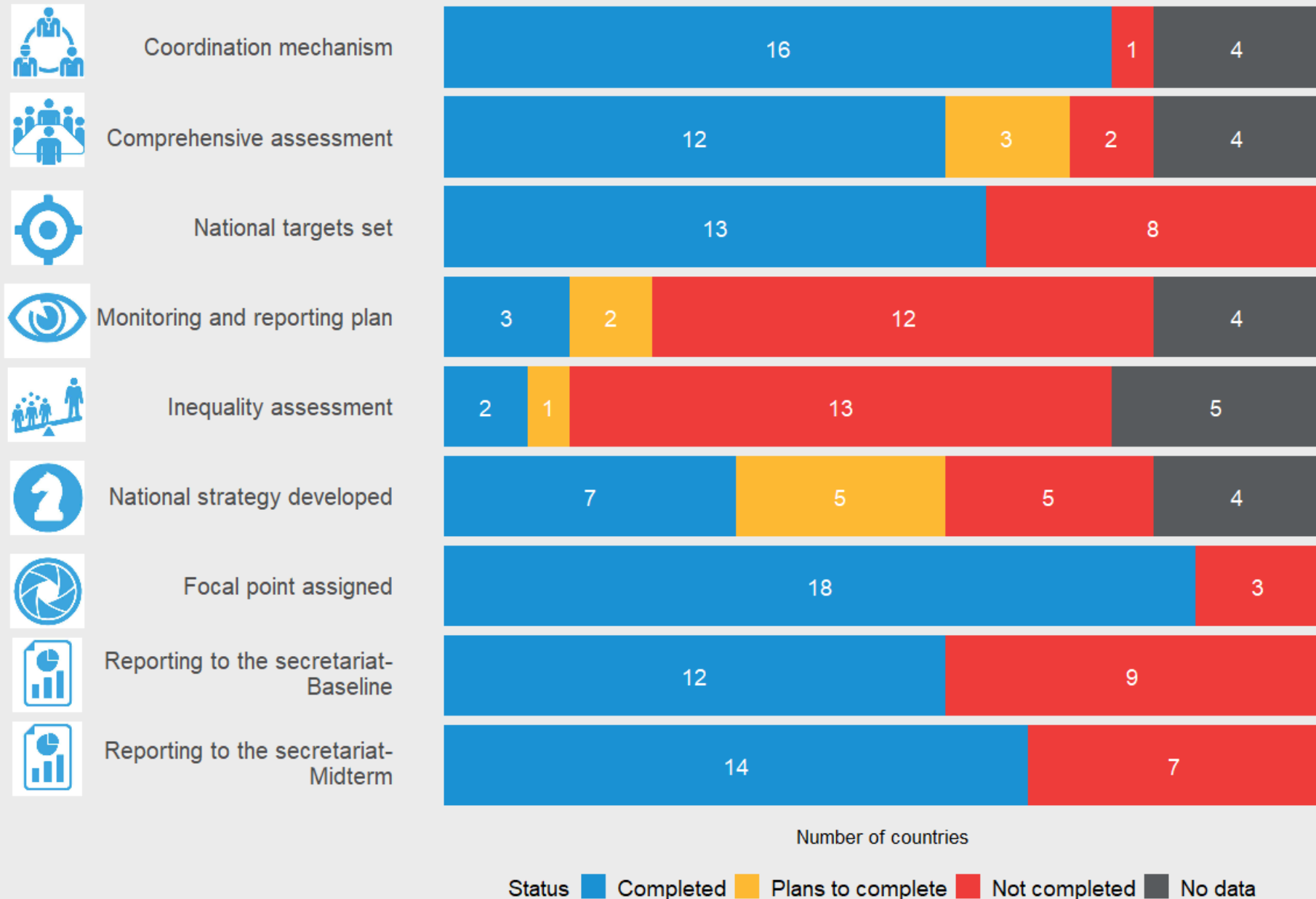


Vital Statistics

Implementation steps: Catalysts of progress



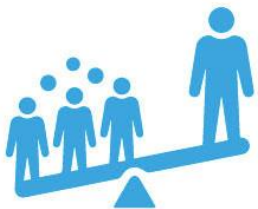
