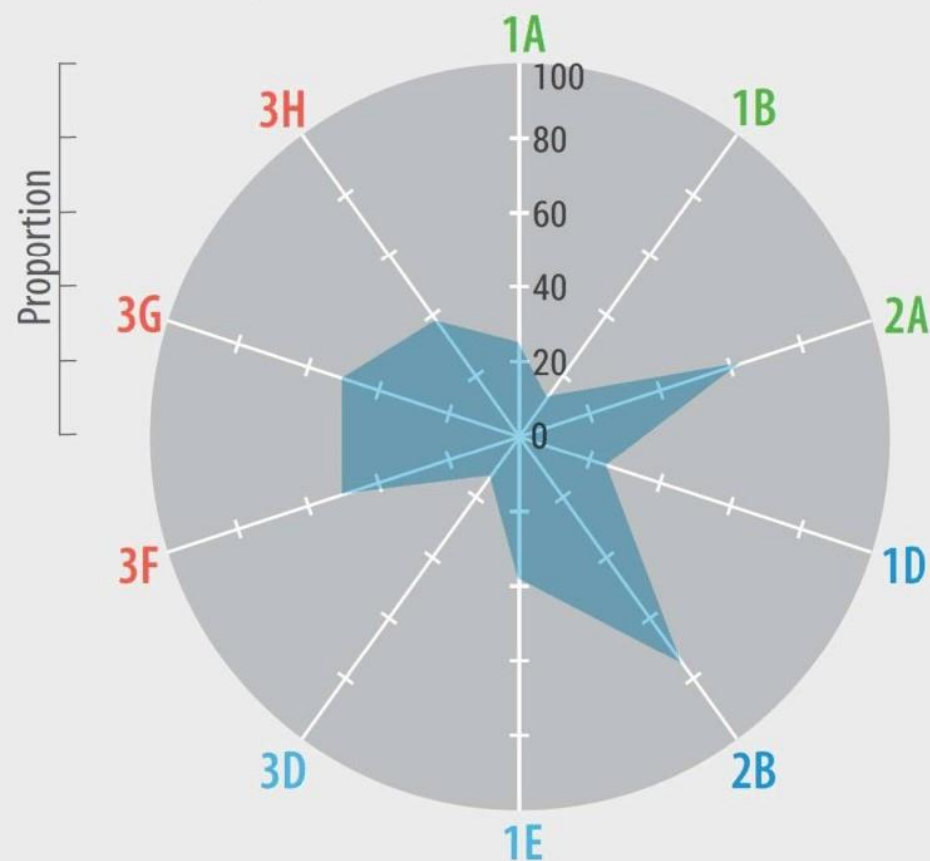

Birth Certificate

Where are we at the midterm of the Decade?

South-East Asia
(representing 8 out of 11 countries)



Targets

1A: Birth registration within a year

1B: Birth registration of children under five

2A: Issuance of birth certificates

1D: Death registration within a year

2B: Issuance of death certificates

1E: Recording of causes of death

3D: Reduction of ill-defined causes of death codes

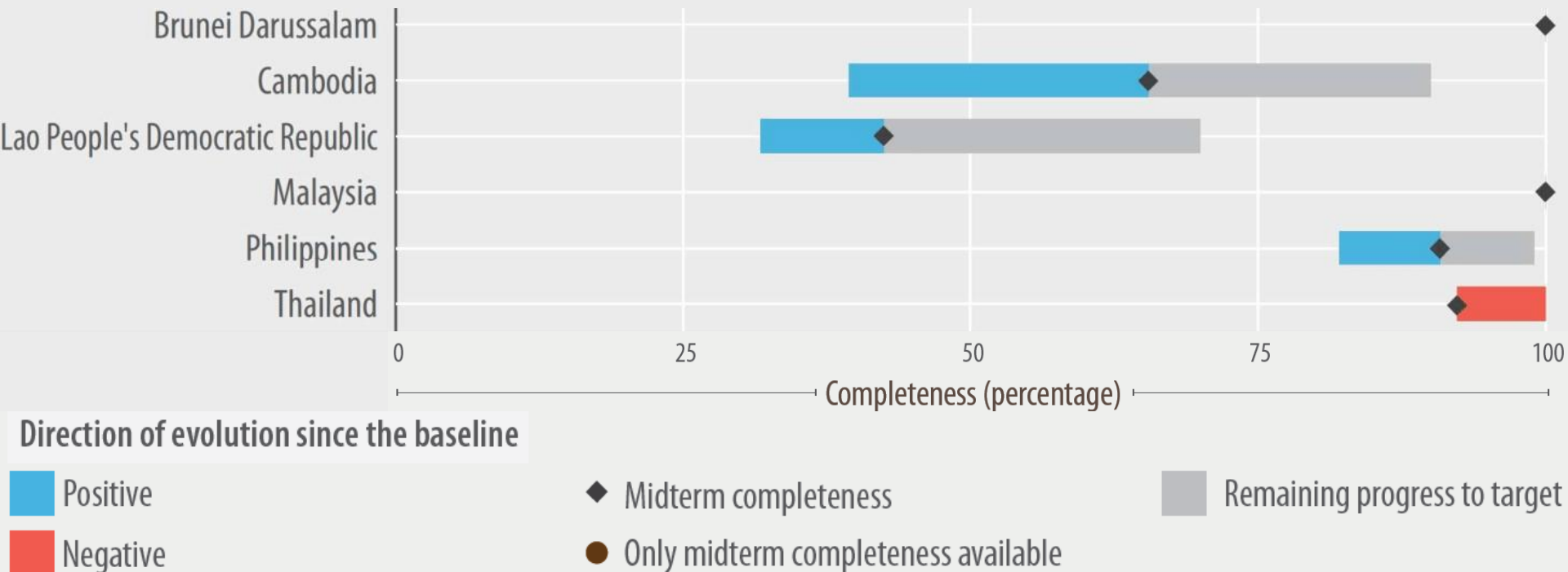
3F: Publication of births and deaths statistics

3G: Publication of causes of death statistics

3H: Publication of a vital statistics report

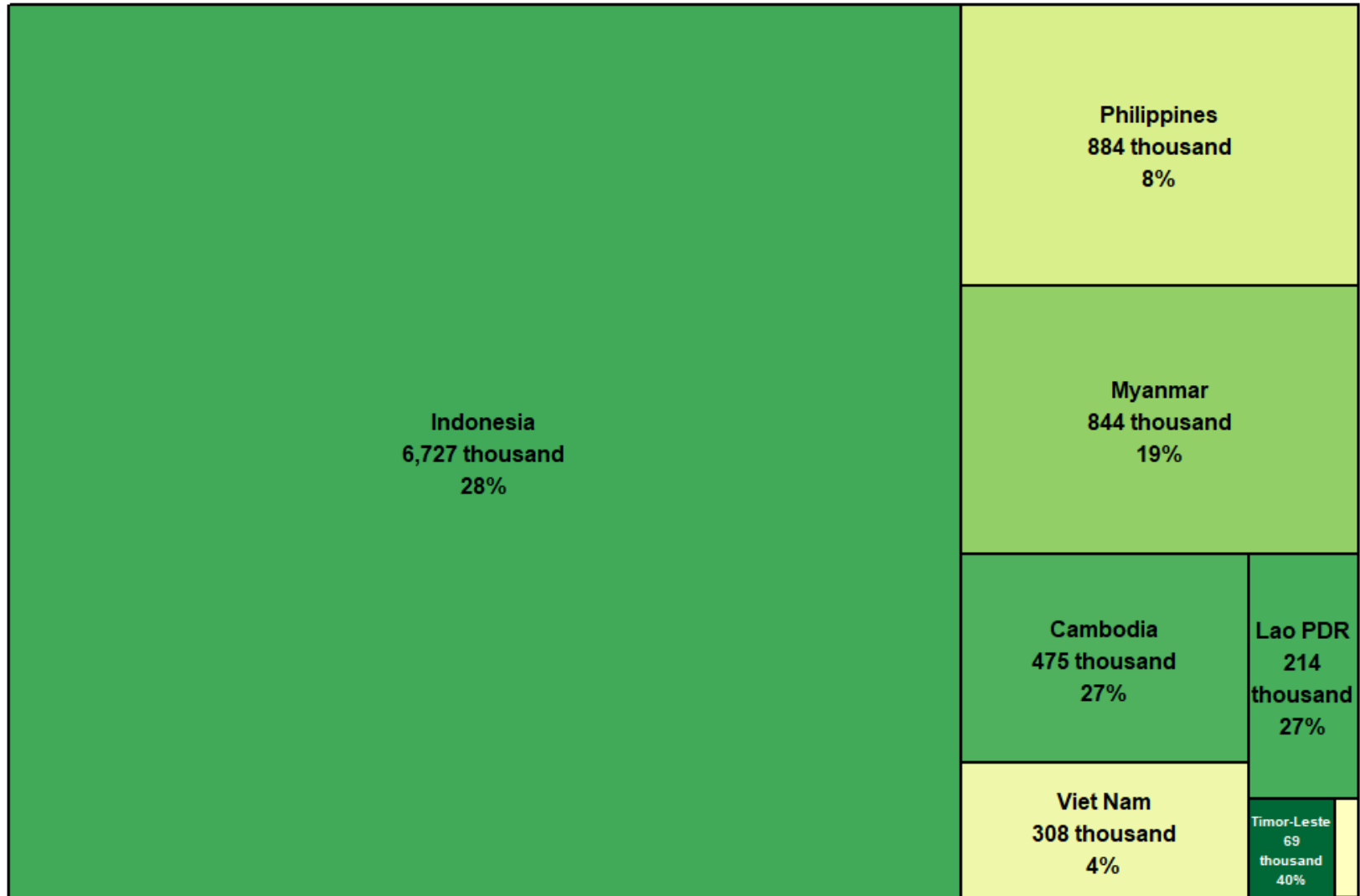
Birth registration:

Progress is bridging the gap between countries



Unregistered children under five

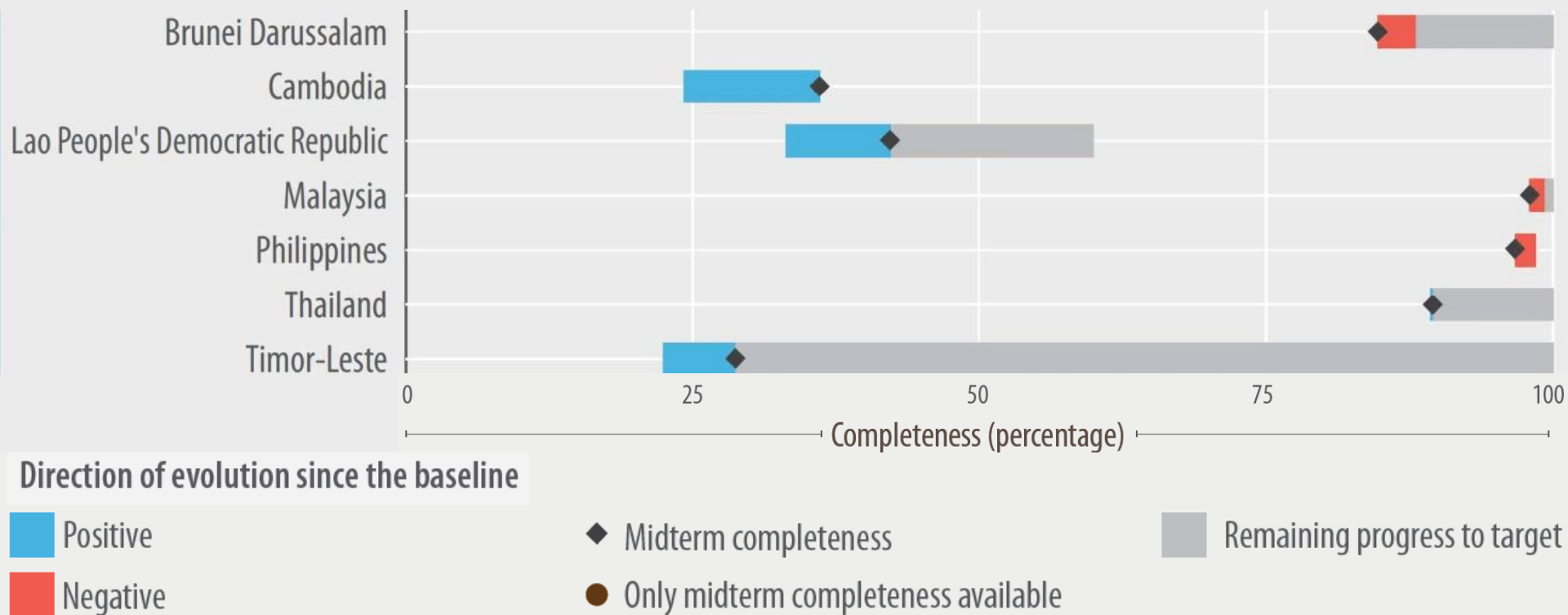
Number of unregistered children under five (SEA = 9.5 million)

Death registration:

Fewer incentives, lower completeness



Recording of causes of death:

Increased attention **due to COVID-19**

Capturing and accurately recording causes of death is critical for **public health policies**

For several countries in South-East Asia, the **quality of cause of death data is low**

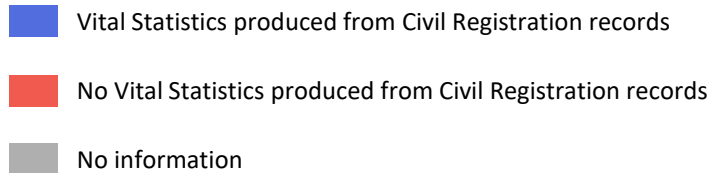


Example of the Philippines:

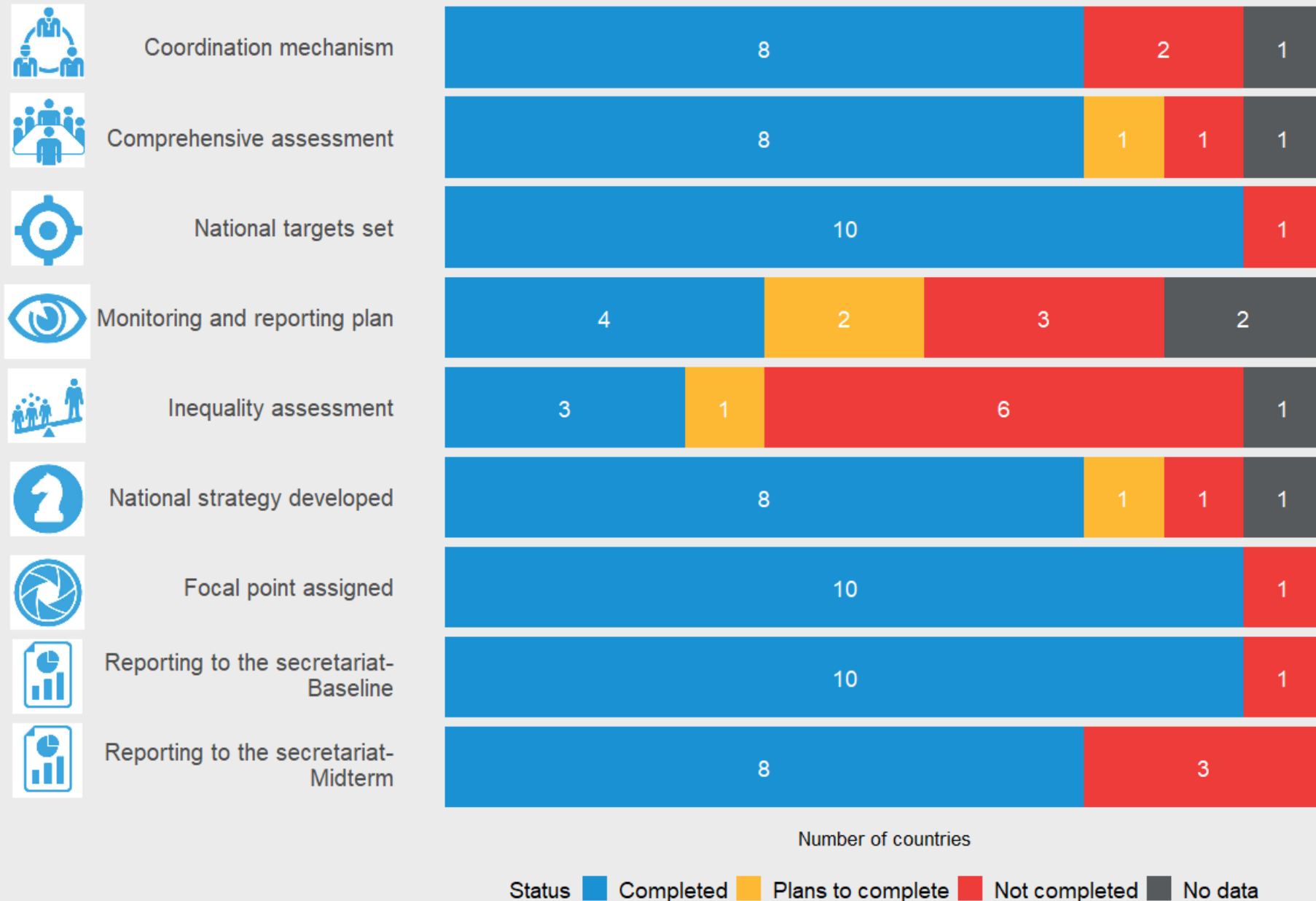
- Closer **collaboration** with the health sector

Vital Statistics:

Progress in statistics production along those of civil registration, but **many remain uncounted**
