Development of needs assessment

- Roughly two-third of children under age 5 have their birth registered (2019-2020 Samoa MICS)
- Death registration completeness could not be obtained
- Incomplete data source
 - Completeness and usability of data must be available
 - Which variable and data could be used
- IT challenges (BDM Life data syatem)
 - What can be extracted from the system and in what format
- Unclear data sharing
 - Data mapping exercise to determine what data to be used for analysis
- Samoa request for capacity building in vital statistics analysis for inequality assessment
