Year	Activity
2015	Members and associate members submit baseline report to the secretariat
2016	Regional baseline analysis
2019	Members and associate members submit midterm report to the secretariat
2020	Midterm regional review conducted
2024	Members and associate members submit final report to the secretariat
2025	Final regional review conducted

Status of baseline reports

Sub region	National CRVS Focal Point identified	Reports received	Total number of countries in sub- region
East and North-East Asia	6	5	7
South East Asia	9	9	11
North and Central Asia	8	5	9
Pacific	15	9	21
South and South-West Asia	10	8	10
Non-regional	1	1	4
Total	49	37	62

- ◆ Report to the 72nd Commission
 - ◆ Summaries of regional situation
 - ◆ Highlighting where countries need more assistance
 - ◆ Provide baseline to assess progress at the mid-term review 2019/2020

Why should we submit our report now?

- ✦ The process **highlights issues** at the country level
- ✦ The process can **increase political buy-in** for improvements, in particular target setting is important for this
- ✦ Provides a baseline for **monitoring improvements** over the Decade
- ✦ Can be used as a **fundraising tool** (regionally and nationally)
- ✦ **Fulfilling the commitments** made at the Ministerial Conference in 2014



Inputs to reporting

- Multiple ministries and agencies will most likely need to be involved
- Possibly through national CRVS coordination mechanism
- Alternatively through specific meetings or electronically

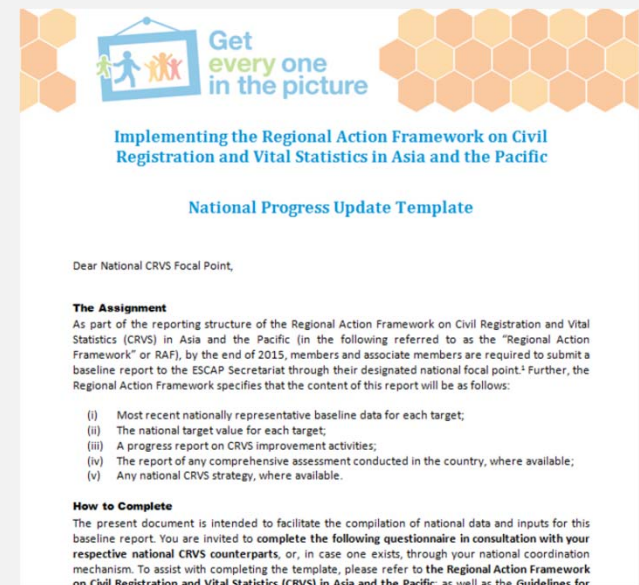

Key elements of the reporting template

- Implementation steps completed or in process in countries
- Baseline data for targets (quantitative data and process)
- National target values
- Supporting qualitative documentation, including assessments, strategies



Support for reporting

- Established reporting structure agreed to during the Ministerial Conference and contained in the Regional Action Framework
- Regional Steering Group for CRVS provides oversight for reporting through the ESCAP Commission
- A standard reporting template was developed by the Regional Steering Group
- Guidelines for setting and monitoring the goals and targets of the Regional Action Framework on CRVS developed

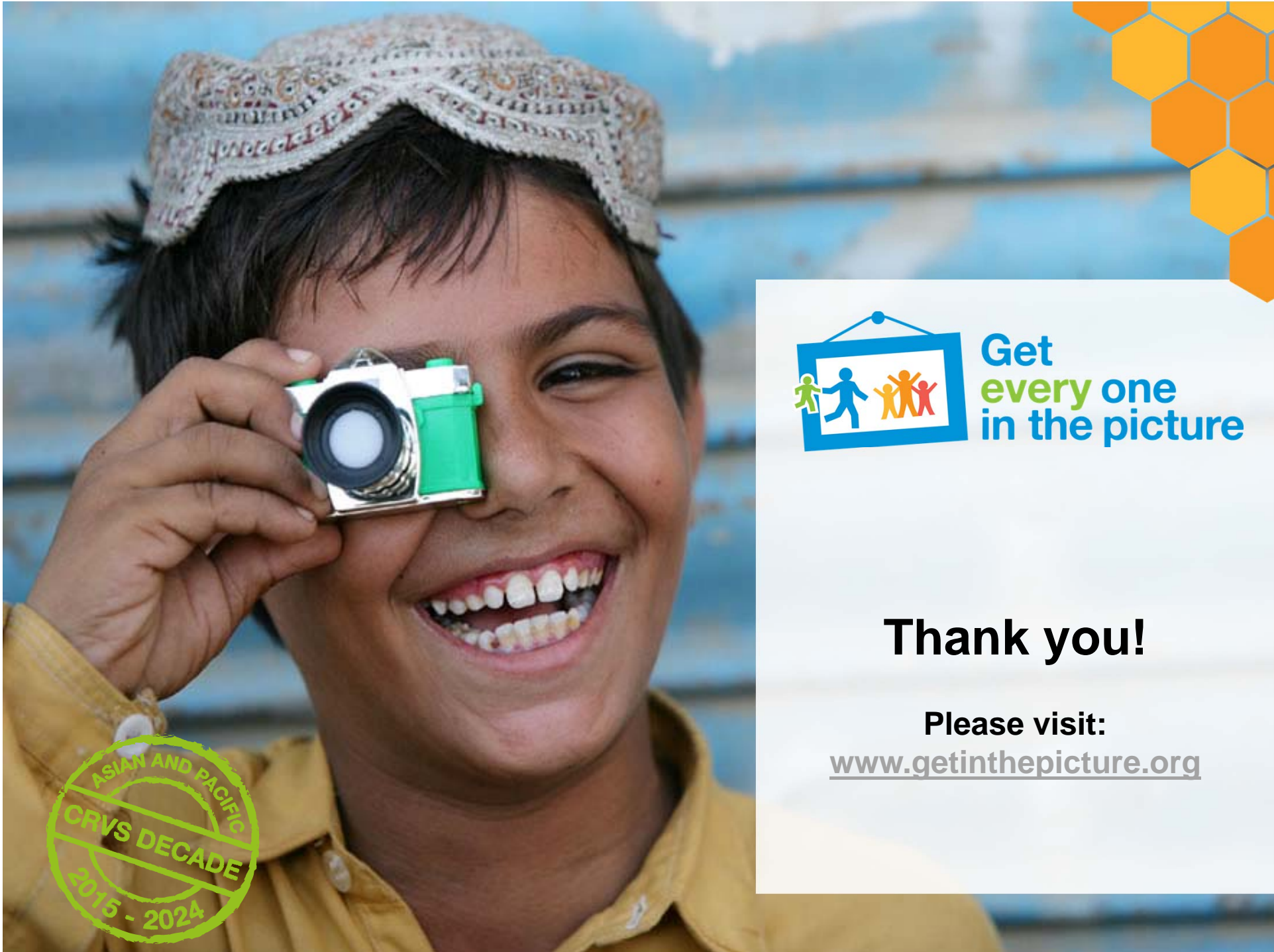
