History

On March 20, 1811, the official center of government statistics of Russia was created - the Statistical Part of the Russian Empire (Statistical Division under the Ministry of Police)

On July 25, 1918, the Decree of the Council of People's Commissars "On State Statistics" formalized the creation of a single state body - the Central Statistical Office.

- In the late 19th and early 20th centuries, information about births and deaths, as well as marriages, was based not on the events themselves, but on the corresponding religious rites.
- At the end of 1917, church registration was replaced by civil registration, and the registration of demographic events was entrusted to local authorities.
- Vital statistics began to improve gradually in the late 1920s.
- By 1939, it was possible to achieve the provision of information to the statistics authorities by all registry offices.

Vital statistics in CIS countries

In all CIS states, the main indicators of fertility, mortality and marital status of the population are being developed.

Fertility: crude birth rate and total fertility rates; fertility rates by age.

Mortality: crude death rate; mortality by cause (based on ICD-10); standardized death rates by cause; age-specific mortality rates; life expectancy (at birth and at a certain age); infant mortality (the calculation uses the WHO criteria for live birth); mortality of children under 5 years of age.

Marriages and divorces: general marriage and divorce rates, average age at marriage, etc.

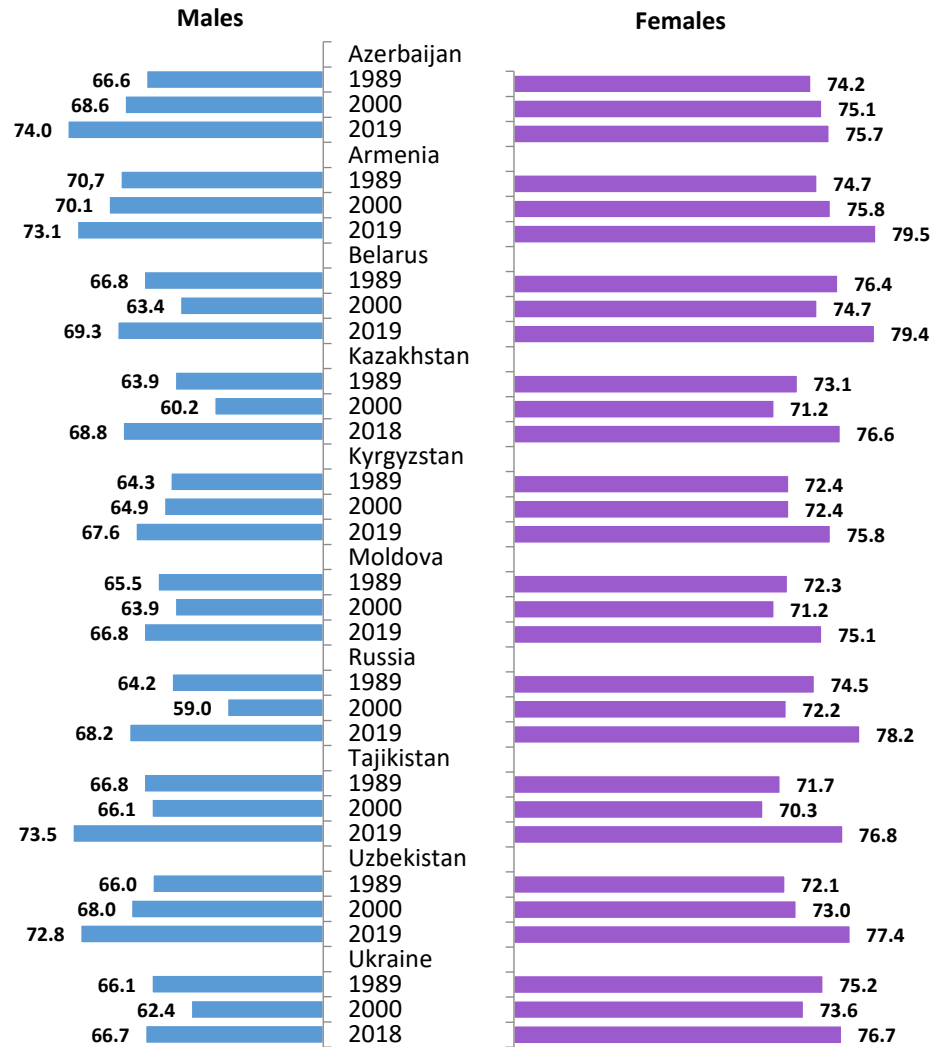
Proportion of countries that

- (a) have conducted at least one population and housing census in the last 10 years;
- (b) have achieved 100 per cent birth registration and 80 per cent death registration.

In the member states of the Commonwealth of Independent States, the level of registration of births and deaths is quite close to 100%.

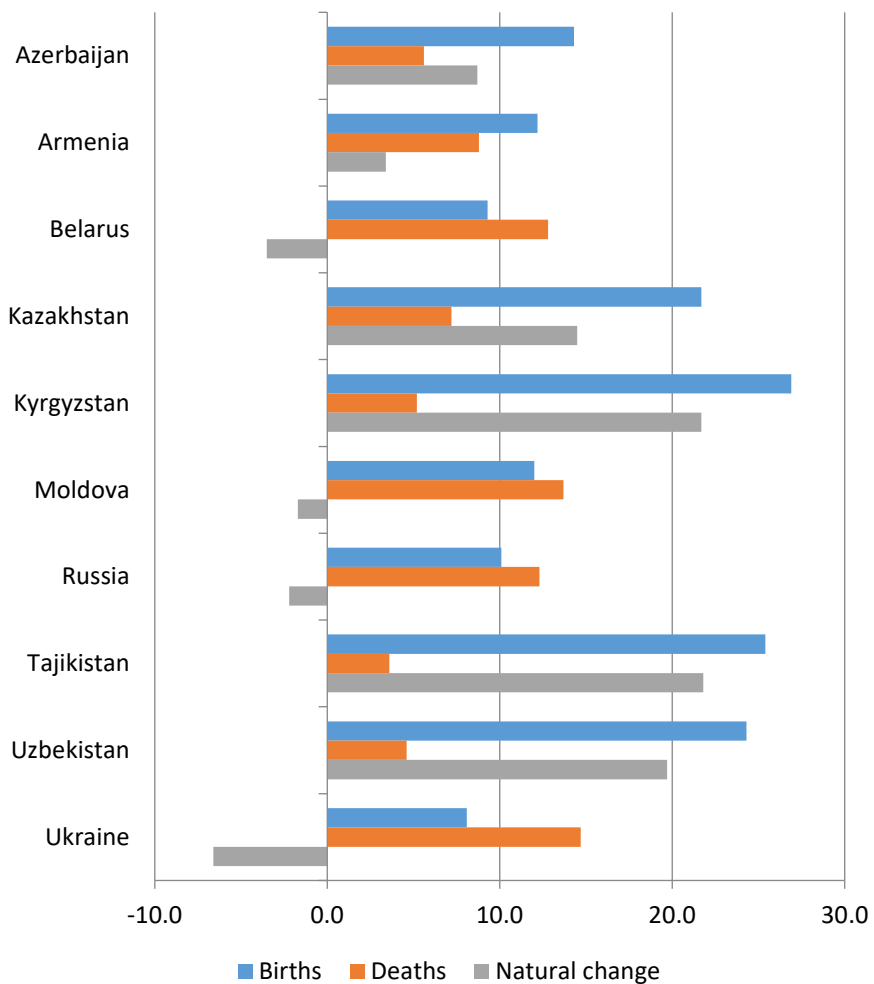
Life expectancy at birth, years



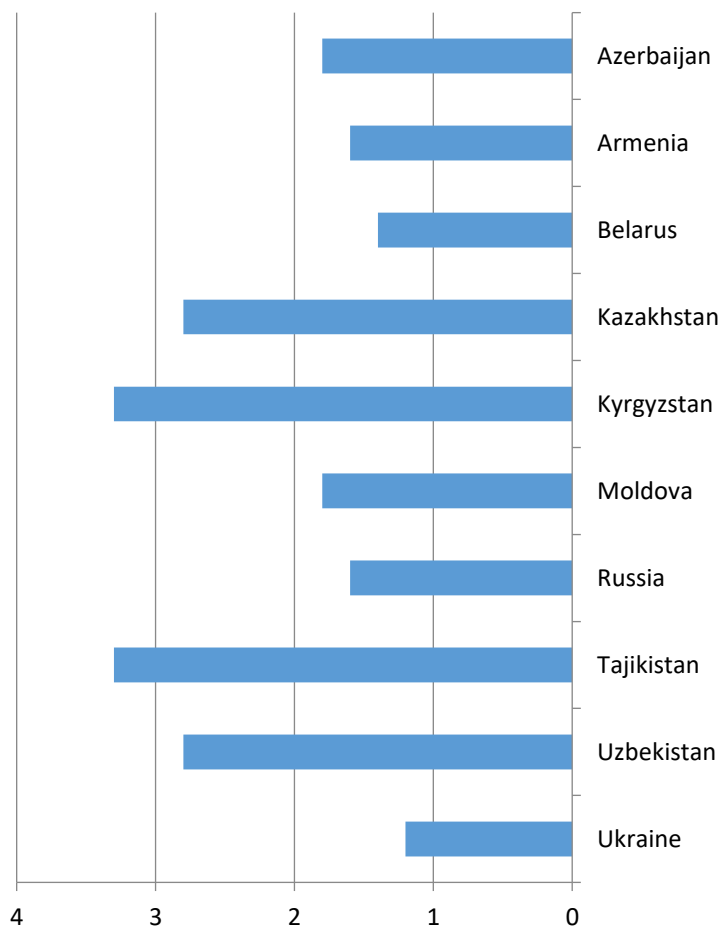

(crude birth, death and natural increase rates)

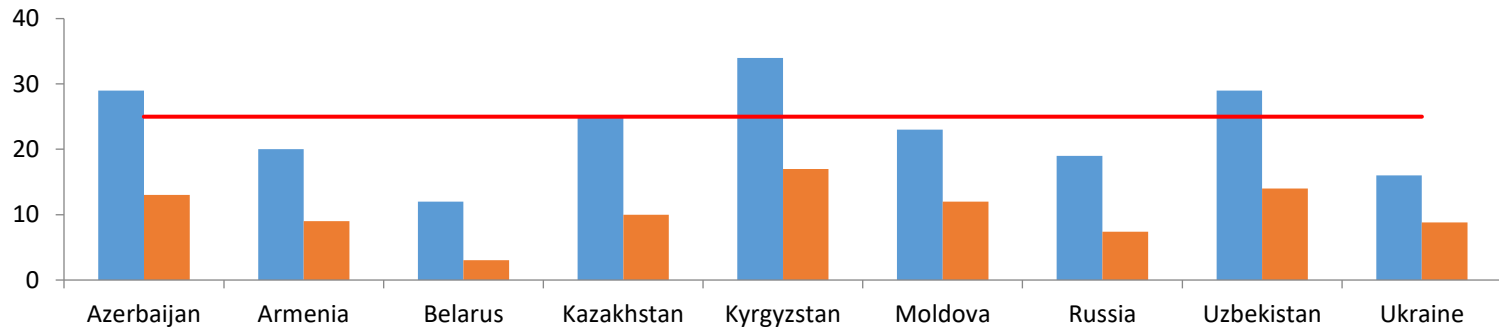


Total fertility rate, 2019

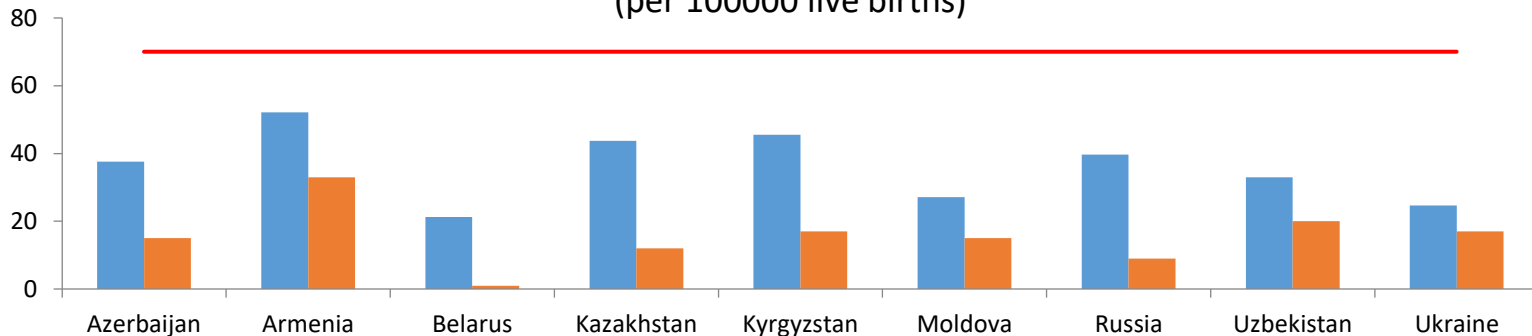
